Assalamu-alaykum
and welcome to *The Night Journey Workbook*. We hope you enjoy the many activities and lessons we have today.

This workbook will help you throughout the day so keep it filled in and up to date.

The first question that you are probably thinking is, "*What is Al-Isra Wal Miraj*"?

Al Isra was a special journey made by our Prophet ﷺ from Makkah to Jerusalem. The Angel Jibrael ﷺ brought an animal from heaven called Buraq for Muhammad ﷺ to ride on.

He travelled to Masjid Al-Aqsa and from there he ascended into the heavens (**Al-Miraj**). He met many prophets on his way through the seven heavens beyond which he spoke with Allah.

Prophet Muhammad ﷺ was given a special gift of Salah during this journey.

Keywords

Prophets

Prophets are special people that Allah chose to teach their people about Allah and how He wants us to live. They would teach the people how to be good.

Muhammad

Muhammad ﷺ was the Last Prophet of Allah. He was sent to all mankind to teach us about Allah and how to live our lives on the Earth.

Masjid

Masjid is the house of Allah. It is a place where we go to pray and also go to learn about our religion. In English people often call it a mosque.

Al Aqsa

Al Masjid al Aqsa is the second masjid to be built on the earth. It is also in a very holy land, Jerusalem. It is the third holiest masjid in the world.



This is to remind us to say 'Sallallahu alayhi wa sallam' (*Peace Be Upon Him*). We must say this whenever we hear or read our Prophet Muhammad's ﷺ name.

Jibrael

Angel Jibrael ﷺ is an angel of Allah. He would bring the revelation from Allah to the prophets. Jibrael ﷺ was the greatest angel of Allah.

Path of knowledge: Who so ever treads a path connected with knowledge, Allah will make the path to Jannah easy for him.



The Journey

Islam is the path that we all walk so make each step solid, like a rock. With each step remember your Lord and in learning Islam don't get bored.

Don't give up because the path is tough to power you along, your Iman is enough. We are all together as we travel along, stick together and we can't go wrong.

Birth

After Amina and Abdullah got married, Abdullah was sent on a trade journey where he passed away. Muhammad ﷺ was born a few months later.

Halima

When Muhammad ﷺ was a youngster, he was taken to the desert to be brought up with the Bedouins by Halima Sadia. She looked after him and loved Him.

Marriage

When Muhammad ﷺ was 25 years old, he married Khadija who was a widow aged 40. They lived happily together and would often help others in times of need.

Death

When Muhammad ﷺ passed away, he was 63 years old. The message had been perfected and delivered to the people. Muhammad's ﷺ mission was over.

Key Facts In The Life Of Prophet Muhammad



Muhammad ﷺ was the prophet of Allah who was an inspiration and a beacon of kindness and good character.

This is a short summary of his life. We should read about this great man in the books of Seerah.

Mount Noor

Muhammad ﷺ was in cave Hira, in mount Noor, on the outskirts of Makkah. Angel Jibrael ﷺ came and taught him the first five verses of the Quran.

Expansion

Islam spread amongst the many tribes in Arabia. There were many forces in and around Arabia who wanted to destroy Islam but were unsuccessful.

Persecution

People began to follow the teachings of Muhammad ﷺ and accept Islam. The people of Makkah began to hurt and bully the Muslims.

Makkah

The Muslims went to Makkah with great mercy and love. All the people of Makkah were forgiven. They were impressed with such kindness and became Muslims.

Rumours

More and more people began to accept Islam so the Makkans started to spread lies and rumours about Muhammad ﷺ. They were trying to stop Islam.

Treaty

A treaty was signed insuring years of peace between the people of Makkah and the Muslims in Madina. In this time of peace, Islam spread quickly.

Sadness

In the year of sadness, Muhammad's ﷺ wife, Khadija and his uncle, Abu Talib, passed away. Also the people of Taif threw stones and chased him.

Uhud

The people of Makkah sent another huge army to attack the Muslims. The Muslims suffered some losses and the Makkans were more determined to attack.

Badr

The Makkans sent an army against the Muslims who were preventing their caravans passing near Madina. The Makkans sent a huge army but were defeated.

Hijra

Allah commanded the Muslims to migrate to Madina where there was a small Muslim community. The Muslims left everything and started a new life in Madina.

Al Isra Wal Miraj

Before the Night Journey

Since Muhammad ﷺ received the first revelation, the people of Makkah had been against Muhammad ﷺ and his followers. Muhammad ﷺ told the people to worship only Allah whilst the people of Makkah worshipped many idols as their god.



The persecution of the Muslims steadily increased as suffering and injury was inflicted on the Muslims. The three year boycott against the Muslims had finished where the Muslims were forced to live in horrendous conditions of poverty and hunger. No one was allowed to trade with the Muslims or have any relations, business or otherwise during this time.

The Year of Sadness

After three years of suffering and hardship, the boycott was finally over.

Shortly afterwards, Muhammad's ﷺ beloved wife Khadija ؓ passed away, who was a great friend and companion during these difficult years. His Uncle Abu Talib also passed away who had given him protection and security against the people of Makkah.



Muhammad ﷺ decided to go to Taif and speak to the people there, maybe they would accept Islam. However, the leaders of Taif told the people to throw stones at Muhammad ﷺ and chase him away from Taif. Muhammad ﷺ was injured, bleeding and exhausted as he escaped from their grasp.

This year was known as the year of sadness. It was in this year that the Angel Jibrael ؑ came to Muhammad ﷺ and the amazing night journey (Al Isra Wal Miraj) took place.

Angel Jibrael Visits

Muhammad ﷺ had finished praying Salah and was asleep at Umm Hani's house

which was close to the Ka'bah. The roof of the house opened up and Angel Jibrael ﷺ came. Jibrael ﷺ then split open Muhammad's ﷺ chest and cleansed his heart with Zamzam and poured wisdom and faith into his chest before sealing it up.



The Journey Begins

Angel Jibrael ﷺ was accompanied by a white animal called the Buraq. It was a white animal, smaller than a mule but bigger than a donkey. Muhammad ﷺ and Jibrael ﷺ mounted the animal and they all set off into the night towards Jerusalem. The Buraq was able to leap a huge distance between each stride. Each stride was as far as the eye could see.

Arrival in Jerusalem

Soon they reached Jerusalem and Muhammad ﷺ dismounted the Buraq and tied it to a ring.

Muhammad ﷺ entered a room which was filled with many people. A call was made for prayer and all the people waited for someone to lead the prayer. Angel Jibrael ﷺ came forward and took Muhammad's ﷺ hand and lead him to the front. Muhammad ﷺ then led the salah for all these people.

After the salah Angel Jibrael ﷺ explained to Muhammad ﷺ that these people who he had led the prayer for were prophets. Muhammad ﷺ was amazed at this blessed gathering of such great spiritual teachers who had taught their people throughout the ages.



The Ascension in Heavens

After this Angel Jibrael ﷺ and Muhammad ﷺ ascended towards the heavens. When they reached the first heaven, Angel Jibrael ﷺ knocked on the

door. He was invited into the heaven. Angel Jibrael ﷺ told Muhammad ﷺ that this was his father Adam ﷺ (the first man Allah created). Muhammad ﷺ greeted Adam ﷺ and Adam ﷺ returned the greeting and said "Welcome O my son! O what a good son you are!"

They then continued the journey to the second heaven.

When they went to the second heaven, they again knocked on the door of the heaven. The angel at the door asked 'Who is it?' and Jibrael ﷺ replied "Jibrael." The angel in the heaven asked "Who is accompanying you?"

Jibrael ﷺ said, "Muhammad", the angel said "Has he been sent for?" Jibrael ﷺ said, "yes" then the angel replied 'He is welcome.'

In this heaven they met prophet Yahyah ﷺ (John) and Isa ﷺ (Jesus) and Muhammad ﷺ greeted both prophets and they returned the greeting. Muhammad ﷺ and Jibrael ﷺ continued the journey into the third heaven.

In the third heaven, they were again met at the door by an angel who let

them in. In the third heaven, they met a very handsome prophet Yusuf ﷺ.

Yusuf ﷺ was introduced to Muhammad ﷺ and he greeted Yusuf ﷺ. Yusuf ﷺ returned the greeting and welcomed Muhammad ﷺ saying "Welcome O' Brother and Prophet". They then continued their journey, ascending into the fourth heaven.

In the fourth Heaven, Again they were allowed into the heaven and Prophet Idris ﷺ was present. They exchanged greeting as with the other prophets before moving onto the fifth heaven.

In the fifth heaven, they met Haroon ﷺ who again exchanged greeting between them and welcomed Muhammad ﷺ to the heaven.

The Sixth Heaven

They continued the journey to the sixth heaven where they met Musa ﷺ who again said the salaam and welcomed him. Musa ﷺ cried out and Muhammad ﷺ asked him what the matter was. Musa ﷺ said that a young man was sent after him and more of his followers will be accepted into Jannah than Musa's ﷺ own followers. He was referring to the

followers of Muhammad ﷺ who was sent after Musa عليه السلام.

The Gifts From Allah

In the seventh heaven, they were again admitted into the heaven by the angel guarding the door. Muhammad ﷺ again exchanged greetings with Ibrahim عليه السلام who welcomed Muhammad ﷺ into the seventh heaven Ibrahim عليه السلام was sitting on a golden throne in this heaven.



Beyond the Seventh Heaven

Muhammad ﷺ and Jibrael عليه السلام continued to ascend past the seventh heaven. He was taken higher until he could hear the scratching of pens. He saw a man disappear into the light. Muhammad ﷺ asked Jibrael عليه السلام who this man was and the angel replied, *"This is a man whose tongue was moist with Allah's remembrance in the world, and his heart was attached to the Masjid, and he never incurred the curse of his father and mother"*

As they continued to ascend, they approached the lote tree which represents the point where no one, who has ascended from below, could go beyond. Jibrael عليه السلام told Muhammad ﷺ that he could not travel beyond this point so Muhammad ﷺ had to continue the journey by himself.

Muhammad ﷺ then spoke to Allah and Allah gave him three gifts including 50 salah to be prayed every day by the Muslims. Muhammad ﷺ then returned and both Muhammad ﷺ and Jibrael عليه السلام continued to descend down through the heavens.

The Reduction of salah

At the sixth heaven, they met Musa عليه السلام who asked what Allah had given him for his ummah. Muhammad ﷺ explained that he was given a gift of 50 Salah. Musa عليه السلام told him that he had experience with his people and that this would be too much for the Muslims to perform. He advised Muhammad ﷺ to return back to Allah and get a reduction.

Muhammad ﷺ returned to Allah and Allah reduced the salah by 5 to 45

Salah. After this Muhammad ﷺ began to descend back through the heavens and again at the sixth heaven he was stopped by Musa عليه السلام. Musa عليه السلام asked about the gift of Salah and Muhammad ﷺ said that the salah had been reduced to 45. Again Musa عليه السلام said that this was too much and that he was sure that the Muslims would not be able to perform 45 salah a day. He advised Muhammad ﷺ to return to Allah and ask for a reduction.



Muhammad ﷺ again returned and the salah was reduced by another 5. Again Musa عليه السلام stopped Muhammad ﷺ and advised him to get a further reduction on the salah. Muhammad ﷺ returned to Allah to ask for a reduction.

This going back and forth continued until the Salah was reduced to 5. When Muhammad ﷺ was descending, again Musa عليه السلام stopped him and Muhammad ﷺ told him that the salah was reduced to 5 salah. Musa عليه السلام again advised him that

this was too much and that he should get it reduced further. However Muhammad ﷺ felt embarrassed to go back to Allah and ask for a further reduction in Salah.

From Jerusalem to Makkah

Muhammad ﷺ and Jibrael عليه السلام continued their descent through the heaven until they returned to Jerusalem. In Jerusalem, Muhammad ﷺ and Jibrael عليه السلام mounted the Buraq and they returned to Makkah.

On the way they helped to catch a stray camel and returned it to the caravan. They also stopped for water from a water container. It was left open by Muhammad ﷺ.

Sharing the Story

Muhammad ﷺ related the story, of this fantastic journey to Jerusalem and into the heavens, to the people. The people of Makkah laughed at this amazing journey and called him a liar. They tried to make a joke of the Muslims.

The people of Makkah went to the Muslims to taunt them about the story and make fun of Muhammad ﷺ and this

unbelievable journey.

Abu Bakr - The Siddique

When they approached Abu Bakr ﷺ and told him the story of the night Journey. Abu Bakr ﷺ replied that if Muhammad ﷺ said this journey took place then it will be true.

Abu Bakr ﷺ knew that Muhammad ﷺ never lied and always told the truth. It was for this trust in Muhammad ﷺ that Abu Bakr ﷺ was known as the Siddique.

A few days later the caravans that were travelling in the desert



arrived. They told the people about the water container that was left open by a mysterious stranger.

Another caravan that arrived told the people of Makkah about how their lost camel was returned mysteriously to them. Many realized that Muhammad ﷺ had indeed gone on this special journey and was telling the truth.

The Story Continues...

This was just one small part in the life of Muhammad ﷺ. Millions of kids study and love the life of Muhammad ﷺ.

He was such an amazing person and his story is inspiring, we too should read it.

The miracle of *al-Isra'* is confirmed in the *Qur'an*. In *Surat al-Isra'*, *Ayah 1*, *Allah* said:

سُبْحَنَ الَّذِي أَسْرَى بِعَبْدِهِ لَيْلًا مِنَ الْمَسْجِدِ الْحَرَامِ إِلَى الْمَسْجِدِ الْأَقْصَا
الَّذِي بَارَكْنَا حَوْلَهُ لِنُرِيَهُ مِنْ عَايِنَاتِنَا إِنَّهُ هُوَ السَّمِيعُ الْبَصِيرُ

which means: [Praise be to *Allah* Who enabled His slave, *Muhammad*, to make the journey at night from *Masjid al-Haram* in *Makkah* to *Masjid al-Aqsa* in *Jerusalem*, which is surrounded a blessed land.]

Al-Isra

Al Isra is the night journey which was made by our

Prophet ﷺ from the Masjid al-Haraam in Makkah to masjid Al-Aqsa in Jerusalem.

What made this journey so special was that it took a very short time whilst in those days it would take months travelling by camel.

This was a miracle but what made it more amazing was that he ﷺ travelled on the buraq which was an animal from Heaven.

The second part of this miracle was that Muhammad ﷺ then led salah at masjid al-Aqsa. The masjid was full of very important people known as the prophets of Allah. Every single prophet that Allah sent to the Earth was present for that blessed salah.

Masjid Al Haram

Masjid Al Haram is the most Holiest Masjid. It includes the Ka'bah and the surrounding Masjid. Muslims must perform the Hajj to this masjid.

Makkah

Makkah is the holy city in Saudi Arabia. This is the city in which our beloved Prophet Muhammad ﷺ was born. The Ka'bah is also in this City.

Jerusalem

Is the city where Masjid Al Aqsa is located. It is known as Bayt ul Maqdis (the blessed house). This literally means the blessed land.

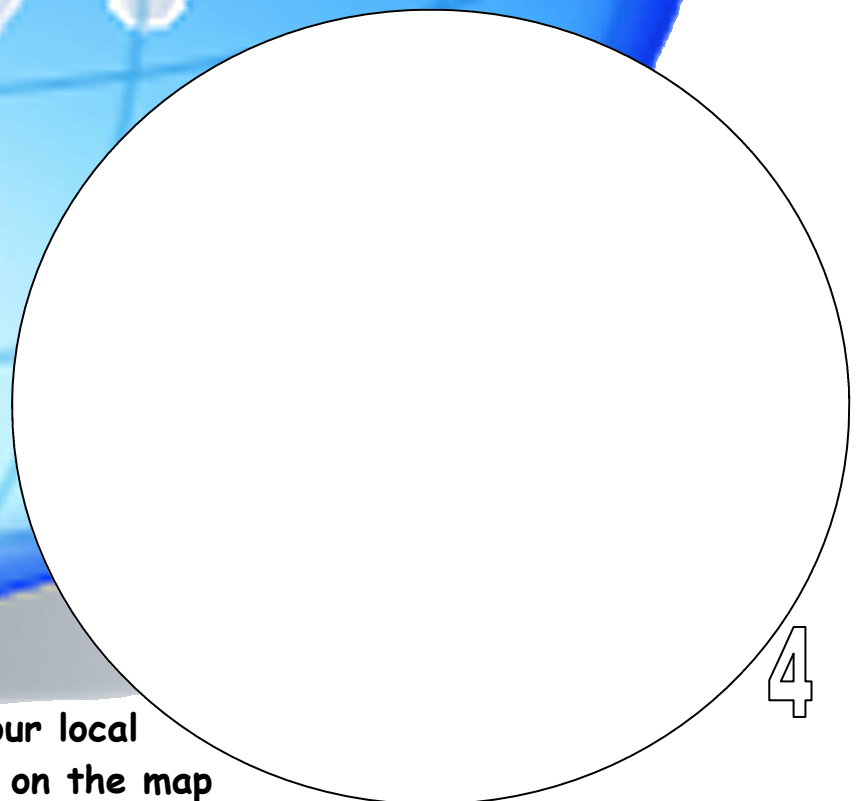

Ka'bah in Makkah

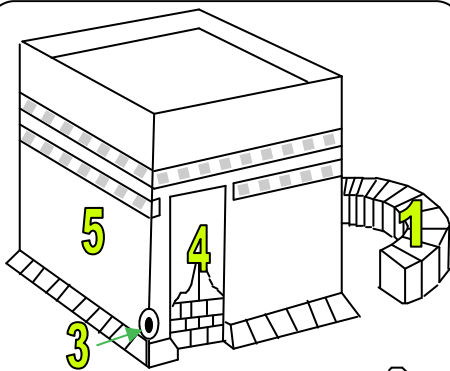
The Ka'bah is a very special and blessed place for Muslims.

Allah had commanded Prophet Ibrahim ؑ to build a house for people to come and worship Allah.

In those days people worshiped idols and other different objects.

Once Ibrahim ؑ had completed the Ka'bah with his son Ismael ؑ, Allah commanded Ibrahim ؑ to announce to the people to come and perform the Hajj to Makkah.

From that time to present day Muslims visit this holy place.



(1) The Hatim is a low wall near the Ka'bah, originally it was part of the Ka'bah.

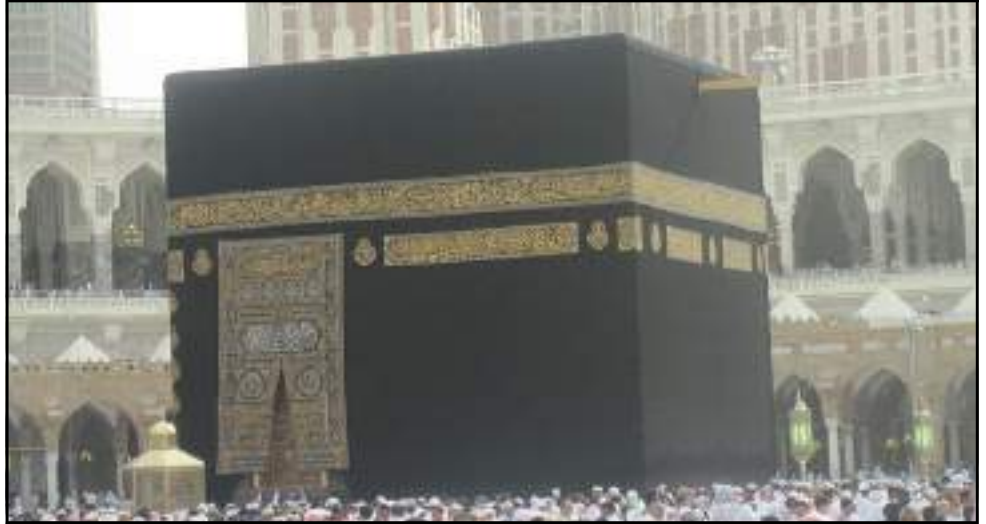
(2) The Maqam-e-Ibrahim contains the stone on which Ibrahim ؑ stood when he was building the Ka'bah.

(3) The Hajri-e-Aswad is the corner stone of the Ka'bah. Angel Jibrael ؑ brought this stone from Jannah to complete the Ka'bah.

(4) The Door to the Ka'bah is raised 2.13m off the ground.

(5) The Kiswa or Ghilaf is the cover of the Ka'bah which is changed annually

KEY

Hajj

The annual pilgrimage to Makkah which must be performed by all Muslims, at least once in their life. This is a very important act of worship, the fifth pillar of Islam

KEY

Qur'an

The Quran is the word of Allah which was revealed to Prophet Muhammad ﷺ through the Angel Jibrael ؑ. It is a code of life for the Muslims.

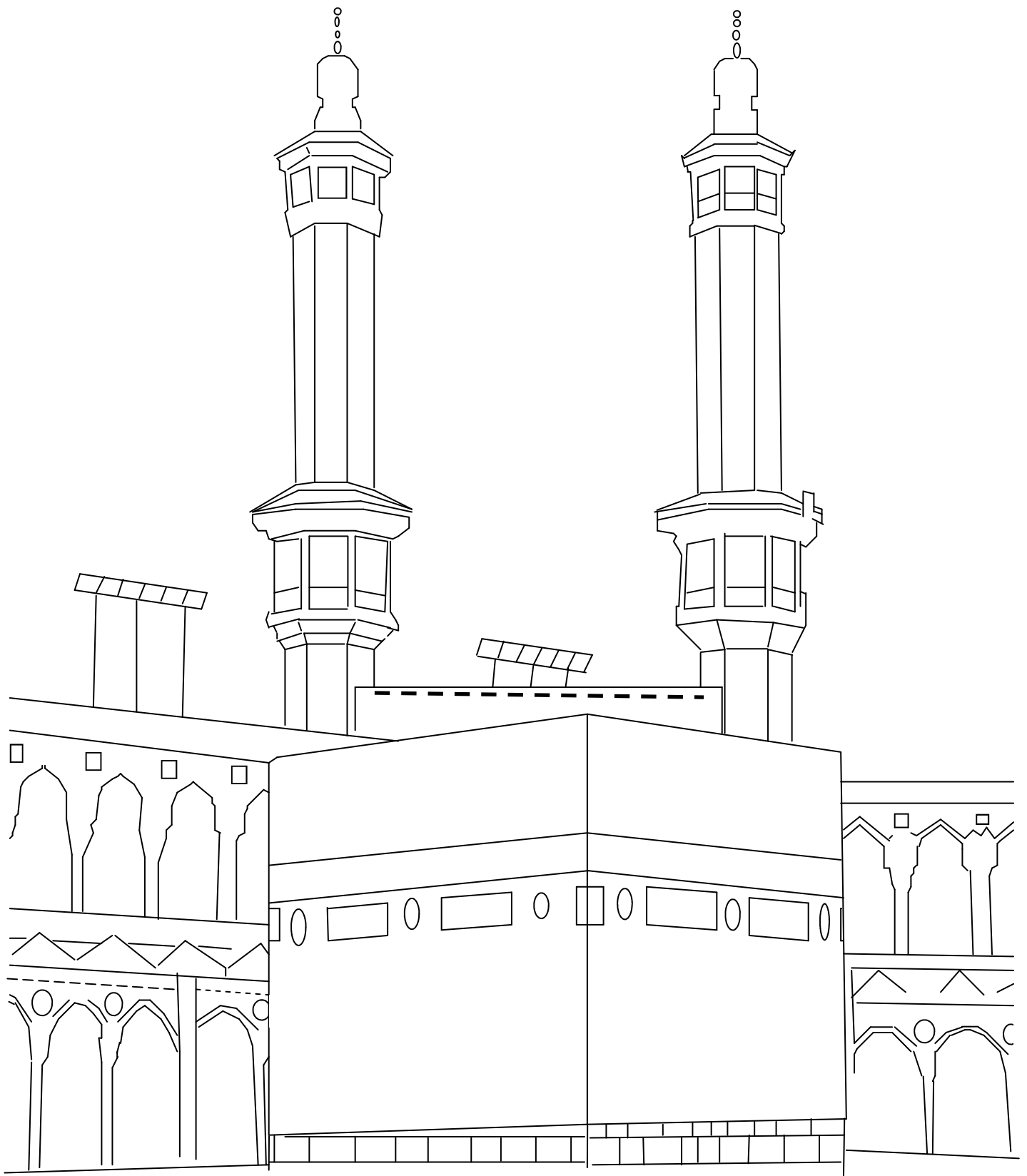
History:

Muhammad ﷺ was born in Makkah in the year of the Elephant. In this year, Abraha came with a huge army which included elephants. He wanted to destroy the Ka'bah.

When they reached Makkah and intended to attack the Ka'bah, Allah sent an army of birds to destroy the army. The birds dropped stones from their claws and their beaks, destroying the army.

Many years later, Muhammad ﷺ was near the Ka'bah, resting. It had been a sad year for him with many losses which had saddened him. This year was known as the year of sadness.

It was in the year of sadness that the Angel Jibrael ؑ came to him with the Buraq. They went on this amazing night journey, moving through the sky at amazing speeds to Masjid Al-Aqsa. This was only the first part of this amazing journey.



The Ka'bah in Makkah

Al-Aqsa

Masjid Al Aqsa was the second masjid to be built on the Earth. It was built in Jerusalem.

It is the third holiest Mosque in Islam.

It is a very special masjid because Prophet Muhammad ﷺ lead Salah there with all the

Prophets praying behind him.

Reading Salah in Masjid Al-Aqsa holds 500 times more reward.

KEY

Qibla

The Qibla is the direction of prayer during Salah. Muslims must pray towards the Ka'bah. The Mehrab is on the Qibla wall in a masjid.

Al-Aqsa Facts:

The first direction of prayer (Qibla) for the Muslims was Masjid Al-Aqsa.

Allah commanded the Muslims to change the direction towards the Ka'bah later on after the Hijrah.

In the Khilafat of Umar bin Khattabؓ, the leaders of Jerusalem allowed the Muslims to take over Jerusalem on the condition that Umar ﷺ gave his personal guarantee.

Umar ﷺ travelled to Jerusalem and made a pledge to the Christian leaders as well as established many masjids.

The whole Masjid Al-Aqsa complex is huge which includes Masjid Umar and dome of the rock masjid.

... to the farthest Mosque (Al Aqsa).

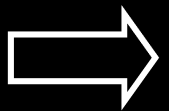


Our prophet ﷺ was lying down resting

Umar bin Khattab

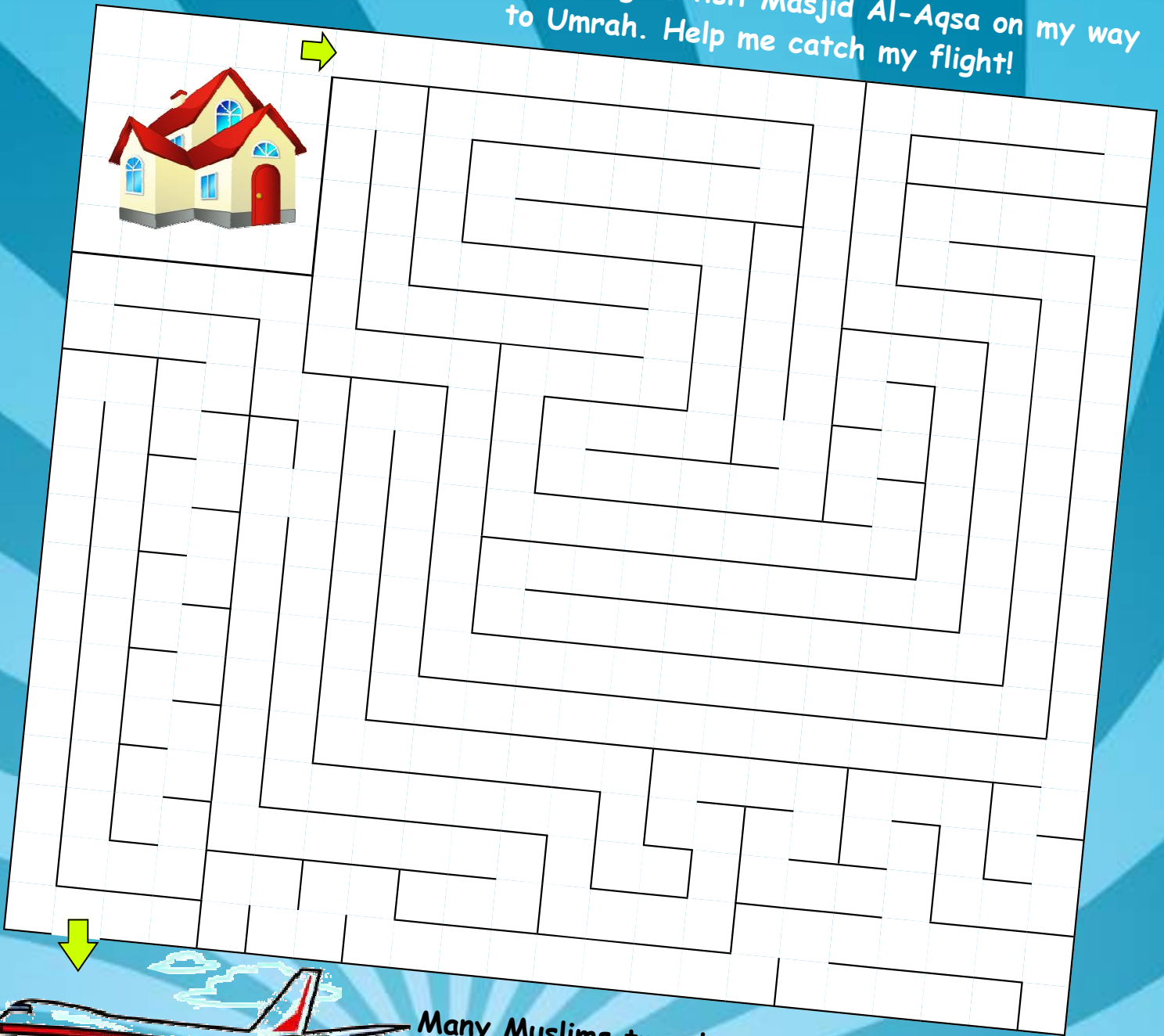

Allah has 99 attributes or names. Through reflection and understanding these attributes, we get closer to Allah.

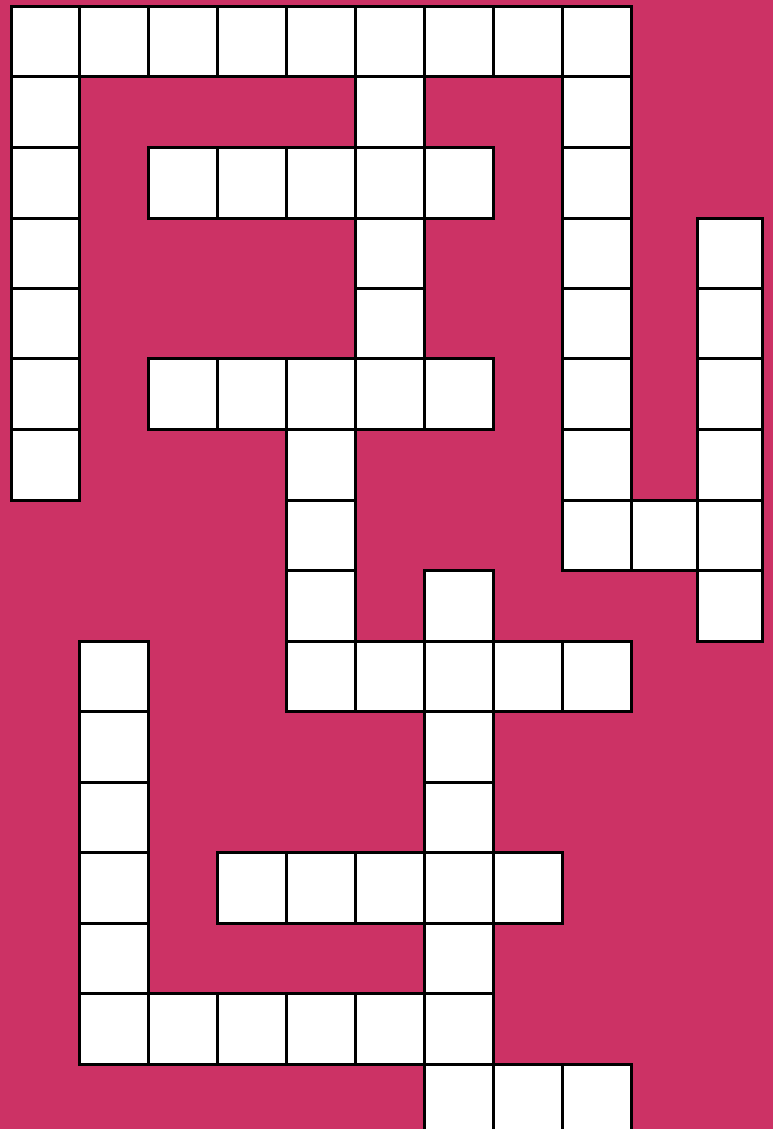

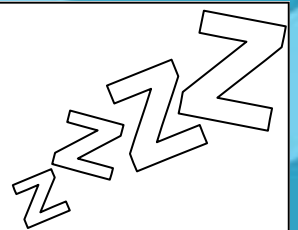

HADITH

Abu Huraira  Narrates

On the night Allah's Apostle was taken on a night journey (Miraj) two cups, one containing wine and the other milk, were presented to him at Jerusalem. He looked at it and took the cup of milk. Gabriel said, "Praise be to Allah Who guided you to Al-Fitra (the right path); if you had taken (the cup of) wine, your nation would have gone astray."

Sahih al Bukhari

Lesson from this Hadith:

We are people of choice. This means we have the choice to do good or bad.

Our nature is to do good and our nafs (desires) is to do bad.

The Milk represents nature whilst the wine represents our desires.

The people that do good are those that are guided. The people who do evil or bad are those that have gone astray.

We should follow our nature and always do good.

Hadith

A Hadith is a record of something Prophet Muhammad  said or did; an action he approved of or disapproved of; Prophet Muhammad's  description.

Sanad

A sanad is the chain of narrations. It is a list showing which person heard it from which teacher until it reached our Prophet Muhammad .

Matan

This is the actual words of the Hadith. The Matan contains the message of the hadith that was narrated. The Matan is the words on the scroll above in black text.

Collector

Is the person who went to learn the Hadith and then compiled it in his book. There were many Collectors throughout Islamic History.

Hadith are important in helping us get a better understanding of Islam.

It can help us get a good understanding of the verses of the Quran the hadith are connected to.

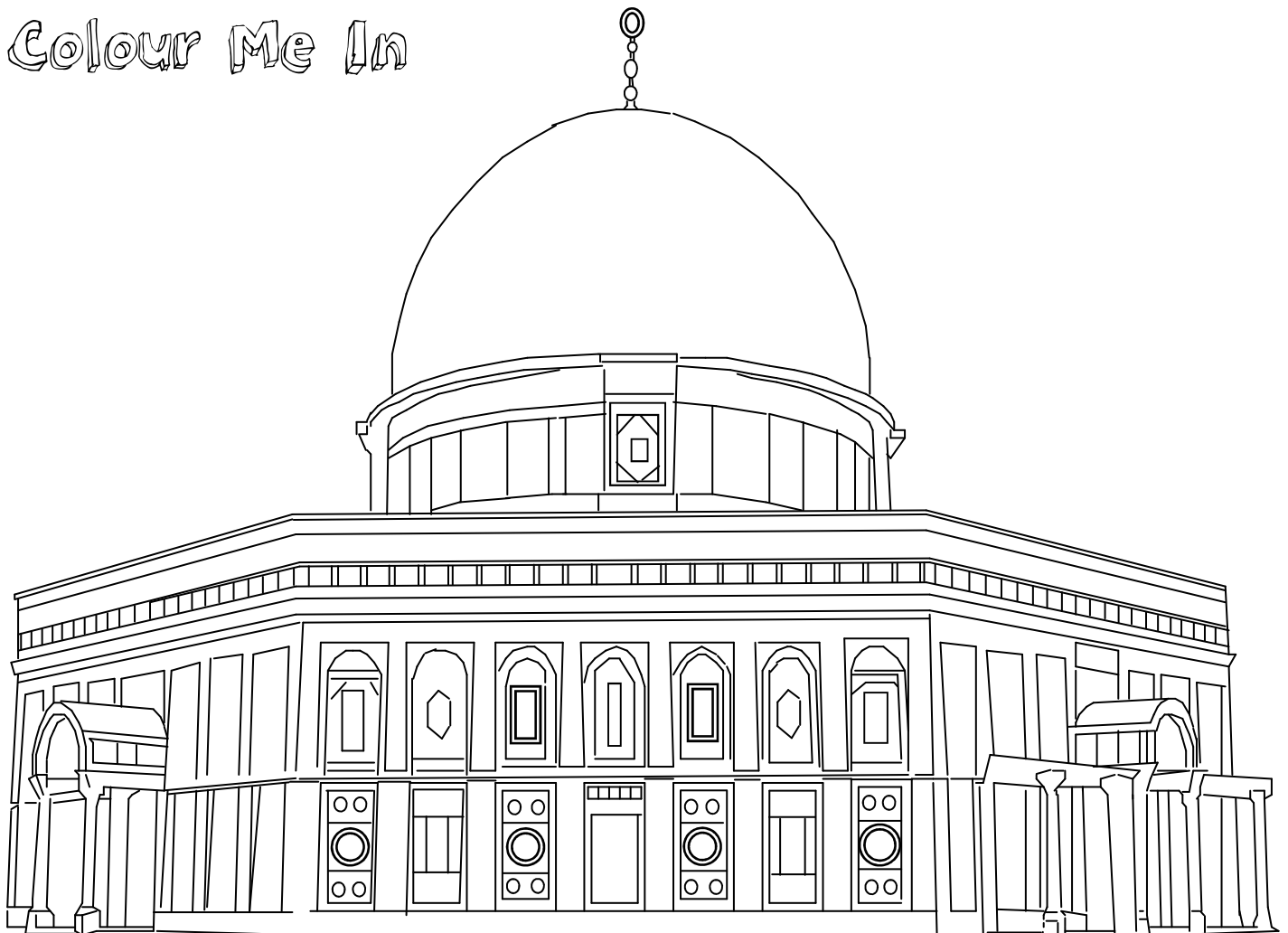

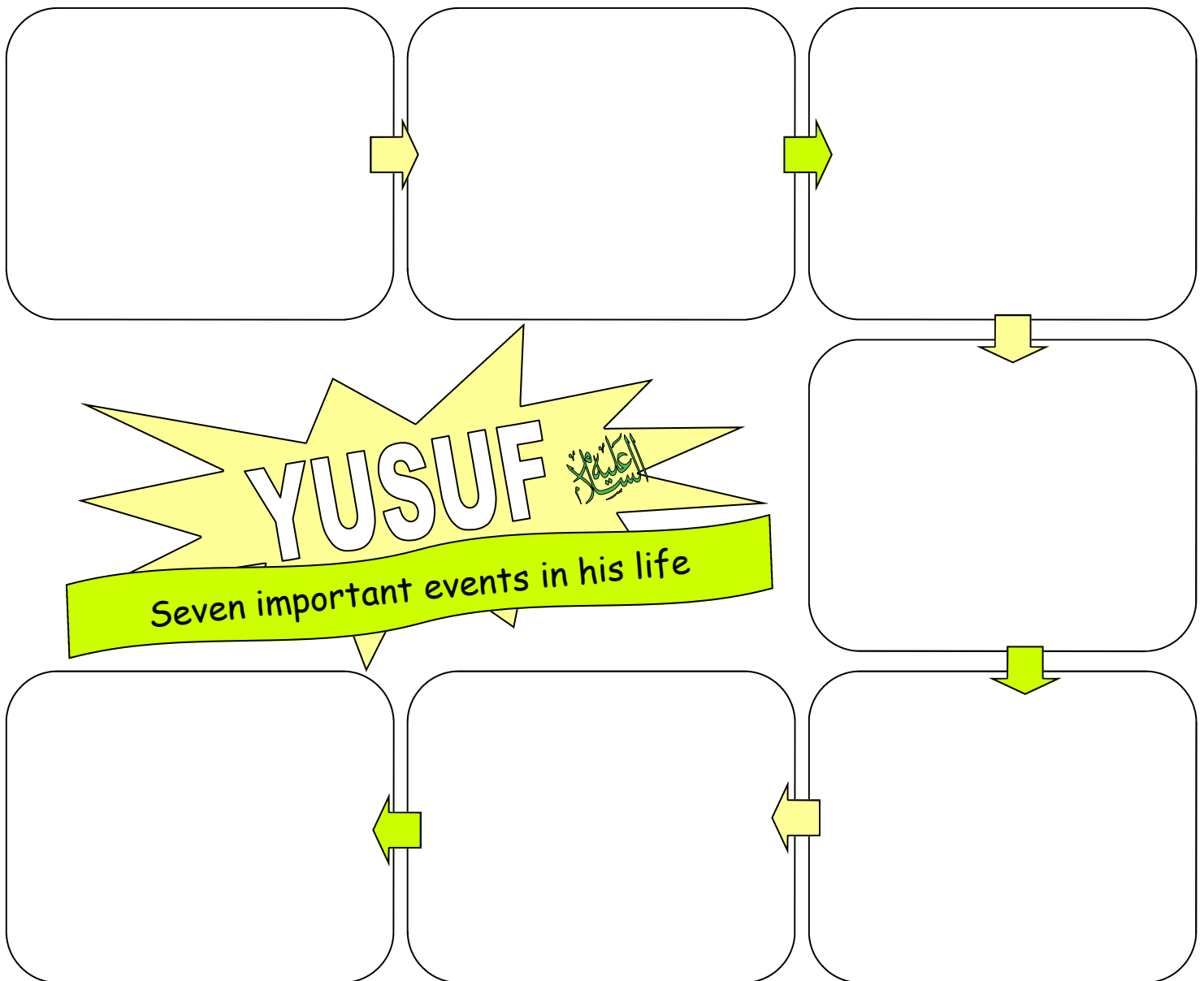

However, when he saw the sun which was bigger and brighter, he thought this might be God.

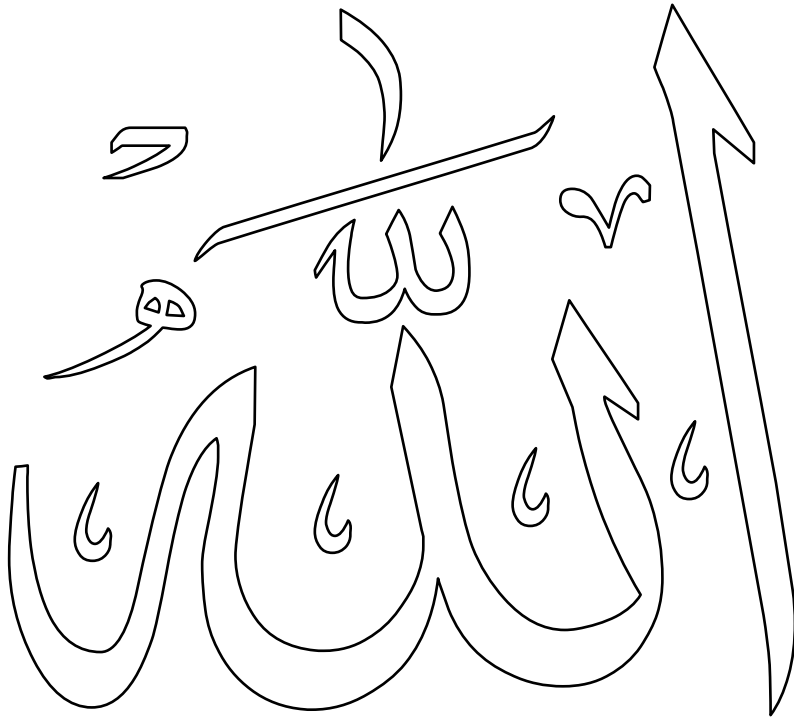
In the evening the sun went down and Ibrahim عليه السلام thought this could not be God either.

JAHANNAM

Our prophet ﷺ also saw the punishments of Jahannam. He met angel Malik, the angel incharge of hell fire. Malik did not smile. The prophet ﷺ saw the punishments for doing bad deeds such as, talking bad of other people, people who do not pay zakah, people who slept without praying, people that consumed which was forbidden for them.

.The Prophet ﷺ also understood that a good deed would be written for the person who intends to do a good deed, even if he did not do it. Also, the good deed performed would be registered for he who performs it as at least ten good deeds - up to 700 good deeds. For some people, *Allah* would multiply the reward of their deeds even more than that.

Additionally, if one performs a bad deed, it is registered for him as one bad deed; yet for he who inclines towards committing a bad deed and then refrains from committing it, a good deed would be registered for him.

GIFTS FROM ALLAH

Musa advised him that he should get it reduced because his Ummah would not be able to meet this obligation.

Muhammad ﷺ returned and it was reduced by 5.

Musa advised him to get it reduced further. Muhammad ﷺ kept returning To Allah until it finally became 5.

Allah gave three gifts to Prophet Muhammad for his Ummah.

Gift 2.

Last verses of Surah Bakarah

These verses were given to the Prophet ﷺ from a special treasure by Allah.

These verses are a special dua that Allah has taught us to make.

The sahabah would say that if a person has even a little bit of sense then that person would not go to sleep without reading these verses first.

When a person commits a sin, Allah can forgive. If a person sincerely asks Allah for forgiveness, promises that he wont do it again then Allah will forgive him.

The gift now applied to major sins as well (not including shirk) which were not forgiven before.

May Allah save us from Major Sins.

Gift 3.

Pardoning Major Sins committed by Muhammad ﷺ's Ummah.

Shirk

Is a major sin which is to associate partners with Allah. Allah is one, if we believe that Allah has any partners or family then we have committed this grave sin.

He passed a caravan that had lost one of their camels, Muhammad ﷺ had stopped and greeted them.

This whole journey of Al-Isra wal Miraj happened in one special night.

In the morning, Muhammad ﷺ related the whole story to his cousin Umm Hani. She believed the Prophet's ﷺ journey.

Returning to Makkah

While at the Ka'bah, the first person that the prophet Saw was Abu Jahal. He was an enemy of Islam. He asked Muhammad ﷺ mockingly "Have you any news today?"

Muhammad ﷺ replied " yes." Abu Jahal then asked "What is it?" Muhammad ﷺ said " Last night I was taken to Jerusalem." Abu Jahal was amazed"

Abu Jahl said "Then you woke up here amongst us?" The prophet ﷺ replied "Yes"

Abu Jahal knew, that the journey from Makkah to Jerusalem normally took months and incredibly, Muhammad ﷺ had made this journey in One night!

Abu Jahl took this as an opportunity to further mock the prophet ﷺ so that people would laugh at him. He advised Muhammad ﷺ to tell everyone his news.

Abu Jahl ecstatically called everyone to the prophet ﷺ, and told Muhammad ﷺ to tell them the story.

Prophet Muhammad ﷺ related the story of his journey to Jerusalem and back. The people of Makkah started to laugh and mock the prophet.

Many started telling others the story so that they could discredit Muhammad ﷺ. They Hoped that when the news gets to the Sahabah they would also laugh and think that Muhammad ﷺ wasn't telling the truth.

They would also persecute the Muslims to cause them pain and injury. In some cases death.

ABU BAKR

The Siddique



Abu Bakr ﷺ was a very close companion of Muhammad ﷺ. He knew Muhammad ﷺ better than any other man, Abu Bakr ﷺ knew how honest and upright the prophet Muhammad ﷺ was. Abu Bakr ﷺ was also the first adult male to accept Islam.

Abu Bakr ﷺ was a great believer and soon after accepting Islam he immediately began to preach Islam to the people of Makkah. He provided great support and friendship to Muhammad ﷺ.

Abu Bakr ﷺ had great love for Muhammad ﷺ and Islam. He was willing to make great sacrifices for the sake of protecting and comforting our beloved Prophet ﷺ.

Abu Bakr ﷺ was a wealthy man and he used his wealth to help the people at times of need. Abu Bakr ﷺ used his wealth to free many slaves that were being barbarically tortured. Abu Bakr ﷺ freed the Abyssinian slave Bilal, who later became a great sahabi and was the first muadhin—the person who makes the call to prayer.

After the Al Isra, when the Makkans were laughing at the prophet ﷺ and didn't believe that the night journey

had happened, Abu Bakr ﷺ said:

"If Muhammad ﷺ actually said this, then it's true"

The Makkans were totally amazed, how can Abu Bakr ﷺ believe Muhammad ﷺ's story!

Abu Bakr ﷺ then said "How can this be surprising, I believe him when he receives revelation from Allah, which is even more amazing"

Abu Bakr ﷺ, like all Muslims, believed that an Angel was bringing great wisdom and guidance from Allah—the Quran. Al Miraj was just another amazing part of this so what was there not to believe?

Abu Bakr ﷺ then went to the prophet Muhammad ﷺ and he asked the prophet if it was true what the people were reporting.

The prophet ﷺ replied, "Yes".

Abu Bakr ﷺ said "I believe you, you have never told a lie"

Abu Bakr ﷺ knew Muhammad ﷺ was a true prophet and always told the truth in all matters. The prophet Muhammad ﷺ, really appreciated Abu Bakr's ﷺ trust at a time when many people didn't believe him and mocked him. Abu Bakr ﷺ was given the title 'Siddique' - a faithful witness of the truth. This title has remained with Abu Bakr right through his life time and even today.

There are no more prophets to come after Muhammad ﷺ. He was the last and final prophet. Everyone is required to follow Prophet Muhammad ﷺ.
